Egypt Valley Country Club Announces \$9.5 Million Golf Course Enhancement Project

ADA, Michigan — May 7, 2026 — Egypt Valley Country Club, a premier private country club in West Michigan, has announced a \$9.5 million capital investment into its golf courses, reaffirming its commitment to preserving its championship legacy while enhancing the member experience for generations to come.

The project, now underway, will be completed in two phases. Phase one includes irrigation system improvements, which began this spring, modernizing critical infrastructure to support superior course conditioning and long-term sustainability. Bunker restorations are scheduled to begin in summer 2026 as part of phase two, reinforcing the Club's reputation for world-class play and elevating both the strategic integrity and visual presentation of the courses. The projects are slated to be substantially completed by year's end.

To support the project, the Club has retained golf course architect Chris Wilczynski, ASGCA to assist with planning and execution. Wilczynski brings more than two decades of experience with Arthur Hills/Steve Forrest and Associates, providing a deep familiarity with the design philosophy of Arthur Hills. His involvement ensures that enhancements will thoughtfully preserve the integrity of the original design while introducing subtle changes. As part of the planned projects, there will be refinements to key playing corridors across both the Ridge and Valley Courses, including expanded fairway approaches, improved green visibility, and thoughtfully reimaged bunkering.

"These enhancements represent both a respect for our history and a vision for the future," said Club President, Troy Schrock. "Our goal is to ensure that Egypt Valley continues to deliver an exceptional golf experience while remaining a leader in championship-caliber play in West Michigan."

Throughout construction, the courses will remain partially open, with members continuing to enjoy access to golf and club amenities.

In addition to enhancing the member experience, Egypt Valley Country Club continues to serve the broader community by hosting nonprofit tournaments that support local organizations and charitable

initiatives. This ongoing commitment is complemented by the Club's deep golf heritage dating back to its founding in 1921, and its reputation as a premier venue for notable events, including the Champions Tour's Farmers Charity Classic and the 2010 U.S. Junior Amateur. With 36 holes of Arthur Hills–designed championship golf across the Ridge and Valley Courses, the Club's investment further strengthens its ability to deliver exceptional experiences for both members and the wider community.
