

DRESS CODE POLICY

Members, member families, and guests shall pay strict adherence to the Dress Code Policy for the golf grounds, the clubhouse, and the athletic areas. The Dress Code Policy has been designed to enhance our family friendly environment. Members are directly responsible to assure that their family members and guests are in compliance with the Dress Code Policy. The Dress Code Policy may be amended for selected club events.

The staff have the authority to monitor and enforce the Dress Code Policy and have been directed by the Board of Directors to withhold service from those who are not properly attired. The Board of Directors may determine that disciplinary action is warranted under certain circumstances.

CLUBHOUSE DRESS CODE

- >> Denim and golf course attire is welcomed throughout the clubhouse. Denim may not be worn to Sunday Brunch or to specified club events. Any clothing, including denim that is torn or tattered is not allowed at any time.
- >> Hats are to be removed by men and boys inside the clubhouse unless inside the Golf Shop. When hats are worn outdoors, they must face forward.
- >> Shoes must always be worn. Golf shoes are permitted.
- >> Cell phones and tablets must be silenced or placed on vibrate.
- >> Athletic wear including: sweatpants, running shorts, leggings without being accompanied by a skirt/skort, tank tops, and other attire that does not meet the dress code of the golf courses are not permitted in dining areas of the clubhouse and on the West Patio.
- >> Tank tops, halter-tops, blouses or tops that expose a bare midriff and bathing attire are not permitted at any time.
- >> Pool attire is not permitted in the clubhouse or on the West Patio or porch. This includes bathing suit cover-ups.
- >> Shorts or pants with exterior pockets (cargo style) are not permitted.
- >> Members are responsible for the attire of their children and guests.

GOLF DRESS CODE

Proper golf course attire is mandatory for members, their guest(s), members' children, and their guest(s) while on the golf courses and all practice areas.

The Golf Shop personnel have the authority to monitor the golf dress code. If an article of clothing is questioned and not changed, the Golf Shop has the authority to prohibit play, or may inform the Board of Directors and a letter will be sent to the member documenting the incident. Second violations will result in action by the Board of Directors and may result in suspension of privileges.

- >> Denim is not permitted on the golf grounds. This includes outings and spectators for golf events.
- >> Men and boys are expected to wear a shirt with sleeves and a collar, turtleneck, or mock turtleneck. All shirts worn by men and boys must be tucked in at all times when on golf grounds.
- >> Hats must be worn forward at all times. Men must remove hats when inside the clubhouse unless inside the Golf Shop.
- >> Men's and women's gym shorts, team athletic shorts, tennis shorts, swim/board shorts and cut-off shorts are not permitted on golf grounds.
- >> Shorts or pants with exterior pockets (cargo style) are not permitted.
- >> Leggings may only be worn when accompanied by a skort/skort.
- >> Men's pants may not have a waist drawstring.
- >> Sweatshirts that have oversized graphics (larger than a 3-inch diameter) are not permitted.
- >> Swimwear (including bathing suit cover-ups) are not permitted to be worn on the golf grounds or in the Golf Shop.
- >> Women and girls may wear sleeved blouses or shirts with a collar, turtleneck, or mock turtleneck, or appropriate crew or V-neck collar. Sleeveless garments must have a collar.
- >> Tee-shirts, tank tops, and tops that expose a bare midriff are not permitted.
- >> Improper attire also includes any clothing that is ripped, torn, or soiled.

POOL & TENNIS DRESS CODE

- >> At the pool facility, swim attire must be suitable for a family environment (full coverage bottoms).
- >> At the tennis and pickleball facility, tennis shoes and a shirt must be worn, bare feet and flip-flops are not appropriate.
